



## **THEMIS Exchange Factsheet 2024/25**

About THEMIS	THEMIS represents a network of top universities which have come together to create a new standard in business law in response to an ever-increasing demand for law professionals with international know-how and expertise.	
	Graduate level law students who successfully complete the following three elements receive the THEMIS Joint Certificate in International and Business Law:	
	<ol> <li>Exchange semester abroad (Autumn semester only at University of St.Gallen)</li> <li>International internship</li> <li>THEMIS Seminar (3 day seminar taking place in Spring semester)</li> </ol>	
Application procedure	<ul> <li>Students will have to meet the requirements of their home university and apply at the home institution within the specific application periods.</li> <li>The home university will nominate the selected students at HSG.</li> <li>HSG Student Mobility Services will confirm nomination and request students to register in the Mobility-Online portal within a registration period.</li> <li>Students register in Mobility-Online and receive a confirmation afterwards.</li> </ul>	
Nomination and Registration process	<ul> <li>Nomination period for partner university: 15 April</li> <li>Once students are nominated they will be sent a registration link from HSG Student Mobility Services with instructions on how to proceed.</li> <li>Registration deadline for guest students: 15 May</li> </ul>	
Pre-Arrival information	<ul> <li>Students must register in the Mobility-Online portal as soon as their nomination has been processed.</li> <li>It is vital that guest students register and then regularly login to Mobility Online portal in order to find all tasks, deadlines and documents.</li> </ul>	
Lecture period	Mid-September to just before Christmas/End of December.	
Orientation Day at HSG	<ul> <li>In the second week of September</li> <li>Student participation is mandatory</li> <li>A detailed Orientation Day Schedule will be sent mid August.</li> </ul>	
SEMP (ERASMUS Scholarship)	SEMP (Swiss European Mobility Programme) scholarships are available - HSG Student Mobility Services will inform eligible applicants on how to apply.	
THEMIS course requirements	<ul> <li>THEMIS students are allowed to take a maximum of 33 ECTS worth of courses</li> <li>Students need to attempt exams worth 30 ECTS</li> <li>Students must pass at least 24 positive ECTS</li> </ul>	
Courses offered at the HSG Law School	<ul> <li>The course list, designed for THEMIS students only, will be sent to the coordinators in May/June.</li> <li>The final course list will be sent to students in early August.</li> </ul>	
Courses outside of the HSG Law School	<ul> <li>THEMIS students have to take part in the HSG bidding in order to get assigned to courses. We recommend students to read the Bidding Fact Sheet carefully.</li> <li>Students are allowed to follow 1 (one) course (up to 6 ECTS-credits) which is not a THEMIS accredited course.</li> </ul>	
The HSG Bidding System	The University of St.Gallen has a unique method for course registration called bidding. All students - both home and guest students - bid for their courses. It is important to familiarise yourself with this process before bidding starts.	
Language of instruction	<ul> <li>All THEMIS courses are held in English language.</li> <li>THEMIS students who are fluent in German are allowed to take law courses from the German-taught law course programme.</li> </ul>	







Language requirements	Level C1 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages in English.)
Number of credits per course	<ul> <li>The course plan for the term abroad must be approved by the home university before starting the exchange semester.</li> <li>Find detailed information about the courses on <u>courses.unisg.ch</u> in the course information sheets of the specific courses.</li> </ul>
Swiss grading scale	1 - 6 (best performance: 6; passing grade: 4)
Transcript of records	At the end of the semester all students will receive an official transcript of records.
Accommodation in St.Gallen	The <u>HSG Housing Office</u> assists students in finding suitable accommodation Registrations will be dealt with on a first come, first served basis. However, many students live in shared flats which they find on the private housing market.

Visa Information	<ul> <li>Visa information will be sent to all applicants directly from HSG Student Mobility Services.</li> <li>HSG Student Mobility Services organises the visa applications for students.</li> <li>The relevant fee must be paid by the student.</li> <li>Visit the <u>Incomings Website</u> for further information.</li> </ul>
Health insurance	<ul> <li>All students must provide proof of full health insurance coverage for the exchange semester before they can get a residence permit.</li> <li>Please check the information provided on our <u>Incomings Website</u></li> </ul>
Residence permit	All students who are intending to stay for more than 90 days in Switzerland must apply for a residence permit within two weeks of arrival in St.Gallen.
