

Checklist: Requirements for Medical/Therapy Evaluations

If you wish to apply for access arrangements or adaptive measures, you must submit a medical or therapy evaluation to the Special Needs Advice Centre after contacting us. See below for an overview of the points that medical evaluations are required to cover. Alternatively, you may also submit the Assessment by Medical/Therapeutic Specialists form provided by the University of St. Gallen.

- Evaluations are not older than two years.
- The evaluation must be written either in one of Switzerland's official languages or in English.
- The evaluation states the student's name and date of birth.
- The evaluation contains an unambiguous diagnosis (four-digit code) according to the current edition of the ICD.
- The evaluation assesses how the diagnosed disability/illness affects the applicant's ability to pursue their studies. It also assesses the applicant's ability to undertake academic work (academic aptitude).
- The evaluation indicates how the disability/illness can be expected to develop (stable, permanent, progressive, recurrent, etc.).
- The evaluation recommends possible ways of supporting the applicant in pursuing academic studies (strategies, aids, pre-examination arrangements, etc.).
- In the case of dyslexia and AD(H)D, please provide a neuropsychological evaluation, including the tests, norms and results used
- The evaluation has been issued by specialist medical staff, as well as signed and stamped by the relevant medical facility.
